In 1885 - Twenty years after the Civil War was over, citizens of the community erected a monument and fountain to honor those who fought in that terrible war. It also reminds us of how important our freedoms are and what was done to keep them.

The monument is very special.

- It's the only Civil War monument in Michigan that's a fountain.

- It's the first one in our country to recognize women's efforts

It is 116 years old and it needs to be fixed because the fountains don't work. It is cracked and corroded.

A group of people, called the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, is raising money to fix it. Their ancestors fought in that war. They also want to help the hungry people in this community.
